

March 13 Special Election

The city of Seattle has requested the March 13 election be conducted entirely by mail. This means that you will receive and cast your ballot by mail, and that your polling place will **not** be open on March 13.

By law, a mail ballot cannot be counted unless voter signature on the ballot envelope signature matches the voter's signature on file. Handwriting styles change over the years. King County Elections sent out a letter last week providing voters with an opportunity to update their signature. **The updated signature form is due by February 16, 2007.**

Accessible Voting

Accessible electronic voting units and assistance with ballots will be available at the King County Elections office for the 20 days leading up to the election (February 21 – March 13).

King County Administration Building entrances on 4th and 5th Avenues are accessible to individuals with disabilities.

Saturday Voting

For Saturday voting, you will need to go through the King County Courthouse to get to the King County Administration Building. You may enter the Courthouse through the 3rd Avenue accessible entrance. There is a tunnel to the King County Administration Building on the first floor of the Courthouse. Follow the signs to the Administration Building and take the elevator to the Elections Office on the fifth floor (Room 553).
